· **Educational Support:** for projects such as Pace School, Woodland Hills Foundation Scholarships, Community College of Allegheny County Founders Endowed Scholarships, Churchill Charter School and Dictionaries for Woodland Hills students

· **Fighting Hunger:** through providing Thanksgiving turkey dinners for 350 people, Rainbow Kitchen WAR on Hunger, and funds for local food banks

· **Community Projects:** include funding for Family Links Angel Tree, Monroeville Arts Council, Wilmerding Community Center, Churchill Community Days, Churchill Garden Club, Lincoln-Lemington Community Walk and Health Fair, Autism Summer Camp at Beulah Presbyterian Church, and Boy Scout Eagle projects
